The project for Best Residential Conversion was Meadow Farm Barn, Saham Toney. New designs were started in 2007, Clayland consulted with the clients to make the best use of the space and create a unique home. The clients wanted to achieve light airy spaces and open plan living in certain areas and cosy and traditional features in others. Clayland created detailed CAD drawings allowing the client to visualize the finished project.

Clayland's tradesmen worked very closely with the clients to transform the barn into a very individual home packed with traditional features including bespoke inglenook fireplaces, exposed oak timbers, stone flooring with under floor heating.
